BUILDING NEW COUNCIL HOMES FOR LOCAL PEOPLE

300+ new council homes to built by 2024

In Epping Forest, we are going against the national trend and building new council homes for local people. More than 300 new, high quality and energy-efficient council homes will be built by 2024, adding to the council's existing stock of almost 7000. To be eligible for a council home we have put in place a policy that you must have lived within the district for at least seven years.

In March we saw the completion of phase 2 of the council house building programme when the final keys were handed over to 51 new properties on Burton Road, Debden, there are a mixture of flats and houses on site.

Unfortunately the official opening was postponed as a result of COVID-19 however before the social distancing requirements came into play, Cabinet Member for Housing at EFDC, Holly Whitbread visited the development with local MP, Rt Hon Dame Eleanor Laing (pictured right). Eleanor was very impressed by the new council homes and pleased to see progress continues with EFDC's council house building programme.



PROTECTING OUR ENVIRONMENT

EFDC declared a climate emergency and the council will work to become carbon neutral by 2030. Cllr John Philip and Cllr Nigel Bedford have been appointed as the cabinet members responsible for this policy. The council is taking action both large and small to help our environment including planting trees through the green arc, ensuring new council homes are echo-friendly and implementing planning policy to protect our environment.



ENHANCING LEISURE SERVICES

Conservative council to deliver a new sports centre, swimming pool and cinema for Epping.

EFDC works closely with Places for People to deliver high-quality leisure services across the district. All our local leisure centres have seen improvements whilst Waltham Abbey has a new sports centre and swimming pool, with Epping soon to follow.

The St Johns Road Scheme in Epping which will be delivered by the council's subsidiary company Qualis will deliver a brand new, state of the art sports centre, swimming pool, cinema, retail, public amenity space and some residential (indicative pictures, left).

FUNDING ADDITIONAL POLICE OFFICERS

EFDC was the first council in Essex to hire three Essex Police Officers. The officers work exclusively in the District and are based in EFDC's offices in Epping. Following the success of the scheme, with a notable improvement in crime figures locally, the council has agreed to continue their funding. EFDC also maintain funding for park guard which are deployed to patrol our local high-streets and work to tackle anti-social behaviour. This is in addition to the 360 Police Officers recruited by Conservative Police, Fire and Crime Commissioner, Roger Hirst and the 135 officers to be recruited with Government funding for 2020/2021.



NEWS FROM ESSEX COUNTY COUNCIL

AN EFFICIENT COUNCIL SET FOR THE FUTURE

Conservative led Essex County Council has been recognised as **one of the top ten councils for efficiency in the country**. The council recently announced their budget for 2020/2021. The budget is laying the foundations for the future with forward looking policies, investing in our communities and supporting local residents. Highlights include:

- £5m for climate action. Lord Randall appointed as Independent Chair of the new Commission.
- £1m for hard working just about managing families.
- £500k for work with police and partners to tackle child exploitation and gangs.
- £130m programme for new roads.
- £750k (£10k per Council division) for local councillors to spend in their areas on community and charity work.
- 1700 new school places being created.



Essex County Council is following Government guidance on the coronavirus emergency and in order to keep our workforce and the public safe, Essex Highways is adjusting how they do things.

Their primary aim is to continue to work to keep local roads safe, particularly for emergency services, key workers and distribution of essential supplies. They are currently continuing with most repair work, but are now assessing the planned programme of more extensive improvements in the light of many unknowns including likely availability of workers, materials, equipment and the need to maintain social distancing.
